**Morning and Evening Prayer**

As of Term 2 the opportunity to attend a daily service of Morning and/or Evening Prayer will be offered. From earliest times, Christians gathered at regular hours during each day and night to respond to God's word with praise on behalf of all creation and with intercession for the salvation of the world. By the fourth century, morning and evening had emerged as the pre-eminent hours for the offering of this sacrifice of praise. A regular cycle of daily prayers constitutes the essential rhythm of life around which other activities can take their proper place. It provides for silence, meditation, reflection, listening to readings from the Bible, and prayer. The offering of intercessions for the needs of our community as well as the world is as integral part of these services. All members of the community, be they students, staff, parents and families or Old Guildfordians will be welcome. Such services can be led by lay people so volunteers to assist would be welcomed.
