

2012 WACE PERFORMANCE

We are pleased to report the WACE results achieved by the Guildford Grammar School boys of 2012 and congratulate them on their fine academic achievements reflected in these results. We acknowledge the hard work invested by these boys and their teachers, supported by their families and friends.

High academic achievement was again a feature of our results, with 27 boys (24%) achieving an ATAR above 90, ranking their results in the top 10% nationally. Seven of these boys achieved an ATAR of 97.5 or more, placing them in the top 2.5% Australia-wide. These boys have the honour of entering Guildford Grammar School's Academic Honour Guild (previously known as the 400 club).

Our special congratulations go to Mitchell Blott, who achieved an ATAR of 99.55 and Ethan Acott who was awarded an ATAR of 99.10.

We also congratulate two boys for being awarded Certificates of Distinction, which place them in the top 0.5% of students in the state. Mitchell Blott achieved Certificates of Distinction in Business Management and Enterprise, English and Human Biology. Jackson Wood achieved a Subject Exhibition and a Certificate of Distinction in Business Management and Enterprise.

A snapshot of the Class of 2012 reveals:

- 27 students (24%) achieved an ATAR above 90
- A further 33 students (29%) achieved an ATAR of between 80 and 89.95
- The School median ATAR (students studying 4 or more WACE courses) was 80.85

It is pleasing to note that 60 out of 112 students, or 54% of Guildford Grammar School students who sat four or more examinations, were placed in the top 20% of the state using the ATAR as the measure.

A further indication of the broad academic ability of this cohort was the high number of admissions to the 2012 Senior Academic Honour Society. Seventeen members of the graduating class achieved entry to this society, which requires the impressive attainment of a minimum twelve A grades, and no grade less than a B, across the first eighteen months of Years 11 and 12.
