### 3 YEAR OLD PROGRAM (Two, three or five days)

The Little Explorers program welcomes boys and girls from three years of age to our unique homelike environment specifically designed for young children.

Our Little Explorers experience the joy of learning as they discover, create and imagine through play and instruction. As they develop their discussion, negotiation and sharing skills they start to form part of a wonderful community.

Our stunning natural environment, sense of home and experienced teachers combine to provide a program that will enhance your child's social skills, love of nature, risktaking, natural curiosity and learning, setting them up for a journey of discovery and wonder.

The Little Explorers program aims to:

- Create an environment where children feel respected and loved
- · Nurture each child's self-worth
- Guide each child's experimental play to promote understanding
- Develop effective communication skills
- Allow children to learn through touching, moving, listening, seeing and hearing
- Encourage each child to explore, invent, discover, question and experiment
- · Develop confidence through child-centred play.

## EARLY learning CENTRE

The early years of learning are a unque and exciting time in a child's life. We know that the right learning environment is essential for the developing brain. The Early Learning Centre at Guildford Grammar School is a vibrant and stimulating space where the focus is on creativity, cognitive action, relationships and movement.

Our approach is student-centred and focuses on the development of the whole child. ### YEARS 1-2

### **WOOLBA WING**

Year 1 and 2 students are engaged in inquiry-based learning that allows them to make strong connections with their environment and builds on the strong foundations built in their early years. To continue to foster a sense of exploration and discovery and harness a child's natural curiosity, we provide a creative and nature-based learning environment that stimulates a spirit of adventure. Strong literacy and numeracy skills are developed using the latest research and appropriate teaching.

Our students enjoy an ideal learning environment that features break-out spaces and discovery hubs, as well as boundless outdoor natural play areas that include the Swan River and foreshore and green, spacious grounds.

Children are encouraged to explore, inquire and make connections across all curriculum areas. The Australian Curriculum and Early Years Learning Framework is supported by a dynamic and broad program that perfectly complements and reinforces the curriculum and each area of inquiry.

We aim to inspire a spirit of citizenship in our young learners and help them to develop mindfulness and empathy.

### Years 3 - 4

### **MONOP WING**

Year 3 and 4 students are inspired in a nurturing and challenging education setting. Students are supported to become independent thinkers and take greater responsibility in their personal learning journey. Computers and other forms of technology become an integral part of learning to equip students with the skills required for their future.

A strong emphasis continues to be placed on literacy and numeracy in these years. Our upstairs book hive boasts an enormous collection of books and novels and provides many opportunities for children to escape in their imagination or engage with the wider world. We believe reading is critical to instilling a passion for learning and spirit of inquiry.

Our proximity to the Swan River and wetlands provide endless conservation opportunities and facilitates a creative and flexible learning approach.

# Years 5-6 JOOBAITCH WING


In the upper primary years, students continue to experience authentic, real-life learning experiences with a focus on critical and creative thinking skills. Engagement is key. Students work collaboratively to construct new knowledge, develop skills and make connections between their learning and global and local issues.

Our curriculum and methods of teaching are responsive to the individual needs and learning requirements of every student. Students are encouarged to question their surroundings and employ inquiry-based learning methods such as research, reflection and communication. Year 5 and 6 students are encouraged to focus on deep learning as they strive for personal excellence.

In response to how students like to learn, technology is central to our education program. Students can draw on a range of online learning resources that facilitate rich learning experiences and allow for close connections between the classroom and home.

As students begin to prepare for the demands of high school and adolescence, a holistic approach to education and wellbeing is further developed in the upper primary years. Children are encouraged to adopt a service mindset and enjoy the vast range of curricular and co-curricular opportunities available to them. Camps, service learning, student leadership opportunities, public speaking, music, sport and passion projects all enrich the lives of our upper primary students and provide boundless opportunities for them to thrive.





### GIFTED AND Talented

At Guildford Grammar School, we understand that each child is different. Each child needs to learn at a different level and pace. It is not a one size fits all approach. We aim to know and understand our students in many ways so that we can provide the support or extension they require.

Our classroom programs celebrate the gifts and talents and passions of our students. We recognise individuals who require extension, enrichment or acceleration in different areas and have developed our program to meet these unique needs.

Our educators differentiate content, processes, tasks and opportunities. Students can work with like-minded peers, take part in competitions and experience a range of co-curricular programs. Our specialist staff work in collaboration with teachers, parents and students to develop their individual profiles so we can challenge, extend and inspire exceptional and personalised learning.

# Beyond THE CLASSROOM

There are many ways that students can add colour and excitement to their educational journey at Guildford Grammar School. Our extensive sports program, co-curricular clubs and art programs allow children to make new discoveries outside of the classroom.



#### Δrt

Children in Years 1 to 6 experience a structured art program that complements the overall curriculum and helps make connections to classroom learning.

Art provides a wonderful platform to showcase both independent and collaborative skills. Through thoughtful response to artworks, students learn valuable critical thinking and communication skills that can be applied to all areas of their learning.

#### Music

All Preparatory School students receive outstanding classroom music education and have the option to extend their music learning through instrumental tuition and participation in choirs and ensembles. Classroom music focuses on music-making, listening and responding to music, vocabulary and performance.

Young children love to engage in music. Kindgergarten and Pre-Primary students explore concepts such as pitch, dynamics, beat and rhythm. They learn to respond to music through imitation, creative performance and movement in a play-based environment.

From Year 2 every student is provided with the opportunity to learn a string instrument, selecting from violin, viola or cello. The students' musical journey culminates with their participation in the Year 6 Band during their final year in the Preparatory School.

### **Physical Education and Sport**

Regular physical activity is critical to health and wellbeing and is known to have a positive impact on academic performance. All students in Years 1 to 6 participate in Physical Education in addition to cocurricular sport.

**Kindergarten – Pre-Primary:** Focus on fundamental movement skills.

**Years 1 – 3:** EduDance, Ed-Gym, soccer, tennis and athletics.

**Year 4:** Volleyball, cricket, soccer, netball, Australian Rules Football, hockey, rugby/touch football and basketball.

**Years 5 – 6:** Students compete in JPSSA home and away fixtures against other independent schools and must select a winter and summer sport option. Equestrian and outdoor adventure programs are also offered.

Students also compete in whole-school carnivals for swimming, cross country and athletics, and can gain selection for inter-school competitions in these sports to compete against participating schools in the JPSSA and local area.

#### Camps

All students in Years 2-6 attend an annual camp. Camps are held at various locations around Perth, including at our Stronghills camp site in the Avon Valley, Point Walter and Forrest Edge.

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# Out-of-School CARE HOUSE

We understand that sometimes the morning routine can be challenging and a little rushed, and often the day doesn't go quite to plan. At Guildford Grammar School, we offer out-of-school care for our students to help relieve busy mornings and allow our families some flexibility in their day.

If you have an early start you can drop your son or daughter into our welcoming 'home from home' environment for a tasty and healthy home-made breakfast and a relaxing beginning to their day, leaving you free to focus on the day ahead.

We walk the children to class and wave them off, just as you would, at the start of the school day. We can look after your child in our Out-of-School Care House from 7.00am in the morning and until 6.00pm in the evening.

Additionally, our after school program provides a safe and happy place for your children to play, enjoy a healthy afternoon snack, do homework or projects and relax with their friends, right up until 6.00pm, every weeknight.

We can provide busy families with the peace of mind that your child is safe and cared for on those days when you need an extra pair of hands.

### SENIOR SCHOOL Transition

We work hard to ensure our Preparatory School students enjoy a smooth transition to the Senior School. This is an exciting time in a child's education journey and we work with our families to provide a seamless transition into the Senior School.

- Year 6 students can attend one of four whole school tours held throughout the year to familiarise themselves with the Senior School campus.
- To accommodate an optimum balance of students across all House groups, House allocations are finalised following a thorough pastoral care review and in consultation with Year 6 teachers, Head of Preparatory School and support staff.
- Year 5 and 6 students and their families can attend a
   Twilight Tour of the Senior School to learn more about
   the House system, pastoral care network and vast sport
   and co-curricular opportunities.
- Step-up Day is held in November each year, providing students with the chance to experience a day at the next year level, participating in fun activities and meeting their cohort.
- Students can participate in summer holiday sport programs to meet Senior School staff and other students.
- Students receive personalised uniform fittings at our Clothing Shop.
- Students and their parents meet with their Head of House in January in the year of commencement into the Senior School. The meeting acts as an introduction to the House and provides the chance to learn about the Senior School's daily routines.
- Orientation Day occurs on the first day of school, providing students with important information about their transition to the Senior School.
