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Our environment

Set on almost 100 hectares of undulating land and just 15 kilometres from the Perth CBD, Guildford Grammar School is ideally positioned to offer boarding students a smooth transition to life in the city.

Boarders feel at home among the rural setting of our spacious campus. Our grounds on the banks of the Swan River offer plenty of green space and vast bushland expanses for students to explore, be creative and be active. Boarders can experience familiar outdoor activites and hobbies that naturally reflect their home environment such as bike riding, sport and fishing.

Our enviable location and scale of land afford a sense of freedom and independence within the safe parameters of our school grounds. Students also enjoy all the benefits of city living, with easy access to both Perth city and Guildford village, providing students with plenty of opportunities to experience an array of recreational and educational activities. Boarders can visit the local shops and cafes in Guildford, explore the surrounding area and play sport locally. Senior boarders can travel into the city on weekends, visit the beach or attend sporting or music events.

As well as the physical space, the Boarding House provides a warm, inclusive and positive living environment for our students. It is a community rich in culture and a natural extension of the home.

Our boarding family

Our boarding home

Boys and girls are housed in separate areas with co-educational common spaces for socialisation and recreation. Students benefit from gender specific common spaces for those occasions when boarders would prefer quiet time alone.

Sleep

Rooms are equipped with a bed, storage space, shelving, wardrobe, desk, chair and a pin-up space. The boarding houses accommodate boarders in quad, double and single rooms.

Eat

Our chefs and in-house catering team provide an exceptional range of food for our boarders, with healthy options, full salad bars and hot options available at every meal.

We cater for all dietary requirements and provide a range of cuisines, with plenty of variety for our students.

All boarders dine together in the School Dining Hall, a grand space rich in history and located at the centre of the School. Our boarding houses include kitchenettes throughout to support our boarders in developing their culinary skills.

Relax

Boarders benefit from an abundance of both outdoor and indoor recreational spaces. Our spacious campus offers many opportunities for outdoor pursuits.

Within the Boarding House, boarders can unwind in common spaces equipped with recreational equipment including pool tables, table tennis tables, gaming consoles, televisions, reading material and board games. Students also have access to computers and internet resources.

Study

Homework and study is an important part of the daily routine for boarders. We aim to provide an environment that allows boarders to work unhindered and uninterrupted, and promotes the development of positive study habits. All boarders benefit from dedicated, supervised study time that is designed to complement independent learning practises. Tutors and mentors are available to assist boarders with academic support.

Health

For boarders who are unwell, the School has a dedicated Medical Centre staffed by qualified nurses and a School Doctor who attends twice a week. If a boarder is sick for an extended period, arrangements will be made with families for boarders to rest and recuperate at home or with a nominated guardian.

Spirituality

We are a school in the Anglican tradition. The Chapel of St Mary and St George has been a part of life at Guildford Grammar School since 1914. A Eurcharist is held regularly on Sunday evenings, with boarders expected to attend. Many boarders take on leadership roles in the services and families are welcome to join. The services provide a wonderful opportunity for prayer, mindfulness and to be quiet in the presence of God. Our chefs and in-house catering team provide an exceptional range of food for our boarders.



The Boarding House

Guildford Grammar School has a proud history in boarding stemming back to its Foundation in the late 1800s, when girls and boys resided at Woodbridge House. With co-education from Pre-Kindergarten to Year 12, the School is able to offer families in Perth exceptional quality co-educational boarding.

Strong community and family connection lie at the heart of boarding at Guildford Grammar School. Since 2020, brothers and sisters have been living and learning together. One school, one pick-up and drop off and one schedule of school events is an advantage for boarding families and further strengthens this connection. Our expanding boarding precinct can accommodate over 200 boarders and incorporates flexible meeting rooms and lounges, study spaces, media lounges, kitchen facilities, a parent lounge, office spaces, staff accommodation and medical facilities. The boarding houses are located on Terrace Road, providing additional security and stunning views across the Swan River flats looking out over our 100 hectare campus to the river.

Boarding at Guildford Grammar School builds relationships for life and will give your daughters and sons an incredible and life-changing educational experience. Being part of Guildford is like being part of a family. The moment I walk back into the boarding house it feels like I am at home again. It's part of me now. It's part of who I am.

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Recreational activities

Our spacious campus on the leafy banks of the Swan River is ideal for sport and recreation. There is plenty of space for our boarders to explore, be free and have fun.

In addition to the School's comprehensive co-curricular program, our boarders enjoy an extensive recreation program that is aimed at providing a full and rich boarding experience. Recreational activity is critical to ensure our boarders enjoy a healthy balance of leisure and study time.

The School has a dedicated Boarding Recreation Officer who develops a program of activities designed to appeal to a wide range of interests and pursuits.
