
Friday Enrichment Program expectations

Kanyana Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to wildlife conservation by:


- · Caring for sick, injured, orphaned, and displaced wildlife

Year 12 WACE Exam Practice (Term 3 only)

This activity is available to Year 12 students studying 4 or more ATAR courses. What better way to prepare for your ATAR exams by completing practice written ATAR exams in the actual venue you will be using under exam conditions. Past WACE ATAR exams will be available in all your courses, or you can bring other practice exams as supplied by your teacher. There will be reading time and working time. There will be a set period around 2.10 where you can choose to have up to a 15-minute break outside, but the idea is you're using the time to complete a full or partial exam. These exams will be given to your Year 12 teacher for feedback and return in class. Your WACE exams are worth 50% of the year's mark and added to the weighting of your trial WACE exam, this is a great opportunity to practise the skill that will have the greatest influence on moderating your final score. Take the challenge and sign up to get the time to sit one or two practice exams in all your subjects.

Titrations (Term 1)

Titration is a technique used to determine the concentration of an unknown solution by using a solution with a known concentration. This Friday enrichment opportunity is offered to develop and perfect the analytical skills of Year 11 and Year 12 Chemistry students. This technique and the theory behind it, forms an integral section of the Year 12 Chemistry course and is designated a large percentage of the course mark. Being competent in this technique allows you to perform to a high level, contributing to your potential to achieve excellent results. You will be entrusted with expensive equipment and learn to use this equipment for precise techniques.

Participation in this program prepares students to enter a national competition, The Titration Stakes, run by the RACI group, which has been running for over 30 years. This is a chemical analysis competition designed to encourage with a passion for chemistry, to develop and perfect their analytical skills and to reward those who attain a high level of proficiency.

UWA Partnership (Term 2-4) ENDORSED





Democracy

Mock Trial Term 1 and 2 (and Term 3 if make finals)

The Law Society of WA coordinates an interschool Mock Trial competition each year for students enrolled in Year 10-12. A mock trial is a simulated court case in which teams contest a fictitious legal matter presented in the WA court system. The cases are presented by two teams – a prosecution/plaintiff team and a defense/defendant team – made up of students playing the roles of barristers, solicitors, witnesses and court officials. The Mock Trial Competition provides students with an opportunity to learn valuable skills in research and in the development and presentation of a persuasive argument. Teams consist of 2 x barristers, 2 x witnesses, 1 x instructing solicitor, 1 x court orderly or judge's associate/magistrate's clerk and 2 x reserves.

Model UN - Term 3

Model United Nations debate simulates a session in the UN Security Council Chamber. In teams of 2 students are assigned a country and a resolution on which to prepare their debate from the standpoint of that country.

This competition provides an opportunity for our students to compete against other likeminded peers developing their public speaking and negotiation skills.




Gymnastics
